Hello! My name is Marvin L. Bennett, better known as Unkle Marvin. I am writing on behalf of the Interfaith Works Emergency Overnight Shelter (The People's House). We serve highly vulnerable single adults and couples without dependent children. We define "highly vulnerable" as persons living with serious mental health challenges, substance use challenges, likely to be over the age of 50, excluded from entry criteria in other shelter programs, chronically homeless as defined by HUD, and living with chronic health conditions and physical disabilities.

From November 2014 through mid-June 2017, we have served nearly 800 unduplicated guests totaling nearly 23,000 bednights to date. We have been at or over 100% occupancy since the second week of operations and unfortunately have to turn away an average of 8 people per night due to lack of space. Since beginning our shelter in November 2014, over 80 shelter guests have moved out of our shelter and into permanent housing. I am one of those 80 people that has moved into permanent housing at the Drexel House!!

I am writing because we are having our 3rd annual "Up In Smoke BBQ" block party on July 29, 2017. Last year I planned this event as a shelter guest and this year I'm doing it as a volunteer because I'm in permanent housing now! Here are some of the things we hope to have at the block party:
